<u>CALL TO ORDER:</u> The regular meeting of the Davison Board of Education was called to order by President Kathleen Sudia at 7:00 pm in the Davison High School Athletic Meeting Room.

<u>PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:</u> The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Early Learning Administrator Susan Vamos along with staff and student representatives of both the Cardinal's Nest and Central GSRP three and four year old preschool programs.

ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION CALLING THE ELECTION: On November 27, 2019 we received notification that the Michigan Department of Treasury approved our preliminary qualification of the bond application and authorized an election March 10, 2020. SUPERINTENDENT'S ANNUAL PERFORMANCE EVALUATION AND

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS:

From our Superintendent:

- Superintendent Brown congratulated the Varsity Football Team for winning the State Championship game against Brighton on Saturday. He stated how amazing it was to look up in the stands to see the wall of maroon and gold worn by the thousands and thousands of Davison fans who attended the game. He is exceptionally proud of the kids, coaches and our very supportive community.
- The district currently has a robotics team at every level starting with our elementary grades through high school. Hill Elementary has three teams that competed on November 23 at Kettering University. The K-1 team earned the Cooperative Explorer's Award. The 2-3 team earned the Building and Discovery Award and the 3-4 team earned the Creative Explorers Award. This is the Hahn Intermediate team's first year. They also competed at Kettering on November 23 and qualified for states. The Siple Stardinals will compete at Schickler Elementary in Lapeer this Saturday at 1:00 pm.
- The Davison Downtown Development Authority will host a Christmas parade on Friday, December 6 beginning at 6:00 pm. The State Champion Varsity Football Team will be featured. Mrs. Flowers and the Siple Singers plan to participate and the District's Traveling Library Bus will be decorated with lights. Mr. Brown also invited the Board of Education to walk with him in the parade.
