

WANT TO VOTE FROM HOME? NO PROBLEM!

Thanks to the passage of Prop 3 in 2018, all Michigan voters have access to an absentee ballot regardless of the reason!

HOW TO VOTE ABSENTEE

First, visit or call your local clerk's office to request an Application to Vote Absentee. The application must be completed before a ballot can be issued.

CHOOSE YOUR PATH

BY MAIL

- 1) Mail your Absentee Ballot Application to your local clerk as soon as possible. Township and city hall mailing addresses and phone numbers are located on the back of this sheet
- 2) Absentee Ballots will be mailed to your home; Ballots are first available at the end of January
- 3) Vote!
- 4) Mail your Ballot back to your local township clerk by **March 6**

IN PERSON

- 1) Absentee Ballots are first available at the end of January.
- 2) Go to your local township hall to hand in your Application; you can immediately fill out your Ballot. Township and city hall addresses and phone numbers are located on the back of this sheet
- 3) Vote!
- 4) Ballots must be returned by 8 p.m. on Election Day **March 10**, regardless of delivery method

REASONS TO REQUEST AN ABSENTEE BALLOT

- You will be away on election day
- You are unable to vote in person
- You prefer not to vote in person

All registered voters in Michigan can vote absentee without a reason.

IMPORTANT NOTICES

- **February 25** is the last day to register to vote *in any manner other than in person*
- If you're voting for the first time and registered to vote by mail, you cannot use an Absentee Ballot for this election **UNLESS** you visit your local clerk's office in person to apply for an absentee ballot. Check your jurisdiction's website for office hours and dates of availability. (If a first time voter registers to vote by mail, they need to show their ID either at the polls or in the clerk's office to be able to vote absentee.)
- Only you, a family member or person residing in your household, a mail carrier, or election official is authorized to deliver your signed absent voter ballot to your clerk's office.
