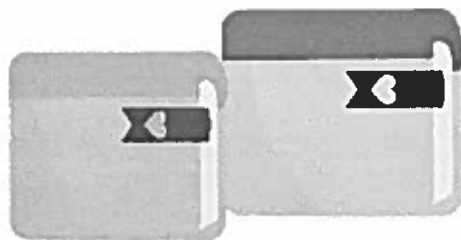


Siple Elementary Kindergarten Suggested Supply List 2020-2021

*The following is a list of suggested supplies we use. They are not required but appreciated. **Please do NOT label items unless noted as we share our supplies.** Please do NOT send in pencil sharpeners or pencil boxes as we do not use these and will send them home. Thank you. so much! Teacher's preferred brands are in parentheses.*

- Crayons, 4 boxes (Crayola)
- Color pencils, box of 12 (Crayola)
- Markers, box of 8 or 10 washable broad tip
- 1 dozen pencils (Ticonderoga)
- 1 box of BLACK whiteboard dry erase markers (EXP0)
- 1 container of watercolor paints (Crayola)
- 10 glue sticks
- 1 bottle glue
- 1 plastic folder with 2 pockets
- 2 boxes of tissue
- 3 large containers of disinfecting wipes
- 1 box Ziploc bags, sandwich size
- 1 box Ziploc bags, quart size
- 1 box Ziploc bags, gallon size
- 1 LABELED Backpack with NO wheels

WELCOME TO 3RD GRADE

We are so excited that your child will be coming to us. Here are some important items that you will want to work with your child on over the summer.

• READ

-Reading this summer is a must. Whether it is you reading to your child, your child reading to you, or even your child reading on their own, 20 minutes a day is suggested and encouraged. **DON'T FORGET**. Be sure to record the time spent each day reading on their summer reading calendars.

- **Ask Questions** Ask your child about what they read. Who is their favorite character, and why or what their favorite part of the story is. You could even ask them to tell you what they predict will happen next in the story.
- **Re-Tell:** Have your child tell you about what they read. Ask them to describe in sequence what happened in the beginning, middle, and end of the story.
- **Listen:** Ask your child to read a page or two out loud. It doesn't have to be for long, but it is important for you to hear them, and for them to hear themselves read. It gives you an idea if they are saying the words accurately and if they are reading like they talk, instead of reading word by word.

• PRACTICE...PRACTICE...PRACTICE Multiplication Facts-

Using flash cards, apps, and games are great ways to develop strong memorization skills.

Children are often excited about purchasing school supplies before the beginning of the next school year. Although we provide all the necessary supplies students may need, here is a list of suggested items. Please do not mark the items with your child's names. These items could possibly go into community bins that all students will have access to.

- (3) Packs of Pencils
- (1) pkg. of Erasers
- (3) Dry Erase markers
- (2) Large glue sticks

- (1) Box of Crayons
(24, 48 or 64 count)
- (1) Box Colored pencils
- (1) Ruler

- (1) Pair of Scissors
- (2) Highlighters
- (1) Box of wide markers

Please do not bring 3 ring binders or Trapper Keepers to school due to limited desk space.

Your child is welcome to bring any of the above items if they prefer a particular kind. We would also like to suggest these additional supplies for your child as well:

- Backpack or tote bag (no wheels)
- 3 Large boxes of Kleenex to donate to the class
- Clorox Wipes
- (3) Loose Leaf, Wide Ruled Paper
- Snack Size Ziploc Baggies
